

The Technical University of Liberec is a public university in Liberec, Czech Republic. Its roots lie in the Technical College of Mechanical Engineering, which was founded in 1953. The college was promoted to a university and took its current name in 1995. Liberec is a city in the Czech Republic located on the Lusatian Neisse and surrounded by the Jizera Mountains and Ještěd-Kozákov Ridge. It is the fifth-largest city in the Czech Republic. It was settled by German and Flemish migrants since the 14th century. Liberec was once home to a thriving textile industry and hence nicknamed the

"Manchester of Bohemia". The city developed rapidly at the end of the 19th century and as a result has a spectacular collection of late 19th century buildings, including the town hall and the opera house, shown on the cover.
